Methodology: face-to-face

1. COUNTRY HIGHLIGHTS

More than seven in ten respondents in Croatia consider climate change to be a 'very serious' problem (72% vs the EU average of 79%) an increase of two percentage points (pp) since 2017. The proportion of respondents who identify climate change as the single most serious problem facing the world has increased by three pp to 11% (though is below the EU average of 23%).

More than half of all respondents (53% vs the EU average of 60%) say that they have taken personal action to fight climate change in the past six months, which is an increase of 15 pp since 2017. When given specific examples of climate actions, the proportion increases to 91% (vs the EU average of 93%).

• Respondents in Croatia are now much more likely to say that lower energy consumption is an important factor in their choice of household appliances (an increase of 19 pp to 39%, though less than the EU average of 48%), and that they try to reduce waste and separate it for recycling (an increase of 14 pp to 68%, but still below the EU average of 75%).

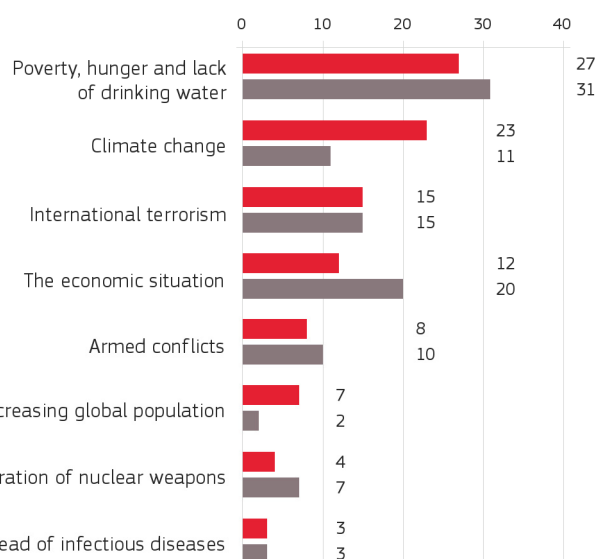
Respondents in Croatia are more likely to agree that reducing fossil fuel imports can increase energy security and benefit the EU economically (79%, above the EU average of 72%), and that adapting to the adverse impacts of climate change can have positive outcomes for citizens (75% vs the EU average of 70%).

A large majority of respondents in Croatia (87%, increased by seven pp, and above the EU average of 84%) believe that more public financial support should be given to the transition to clean energies.

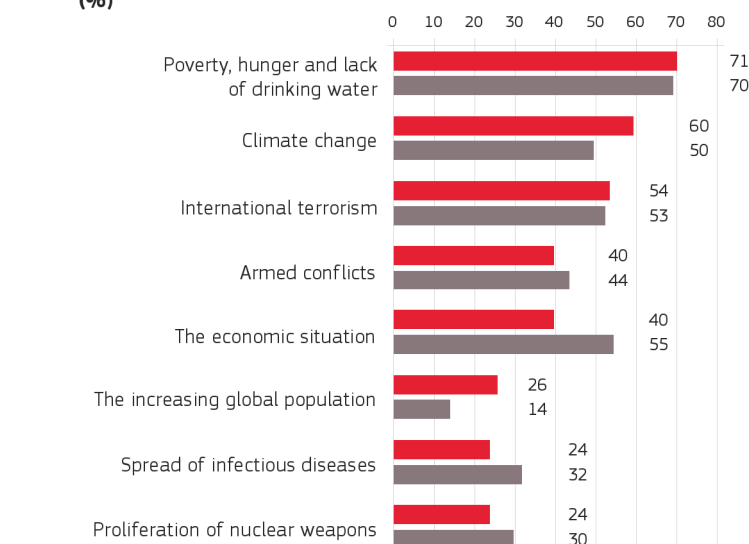
Most importantly, the vast majority of respondents in Croatia (93%, just above the EU average of 92%) support the aim of making the EU economy climate-neutral by 2050.

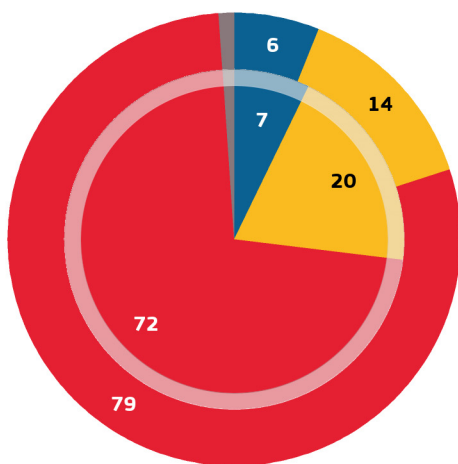

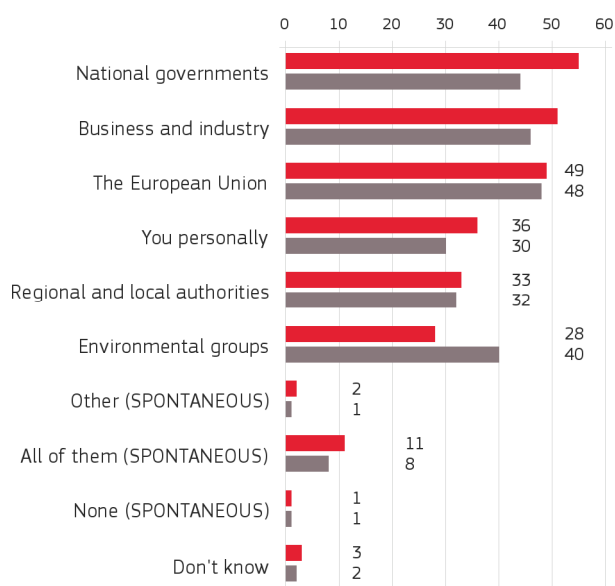

QB3 In your opinion, who within the EU is responsible for tackling climate change? (MULTIPLE ANSWERS POSSIBLE)

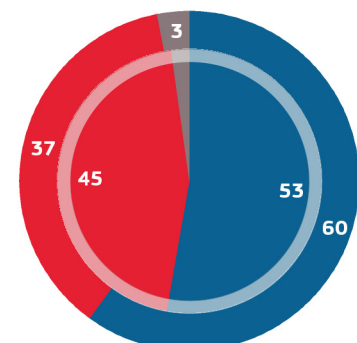

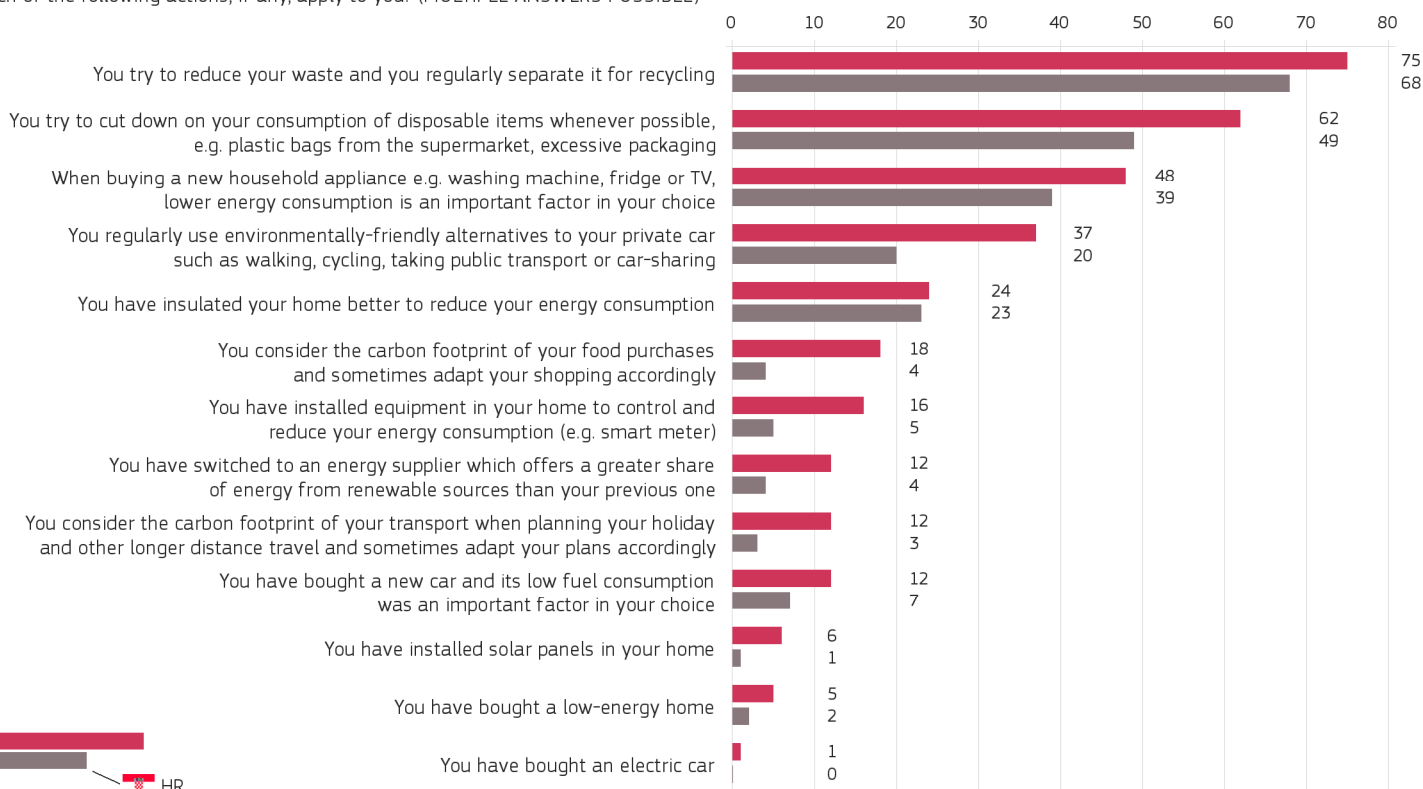

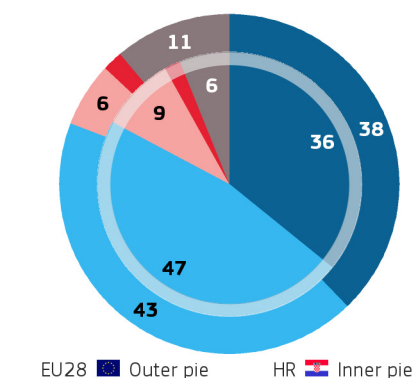
QB6 Which of the following actions, if any, apply to you? (MULTIPLE ANSWERS POSSIBLE)

Promoting EU expertise in new clean technologies to countries outside the EU can benefit the EU economically (%)

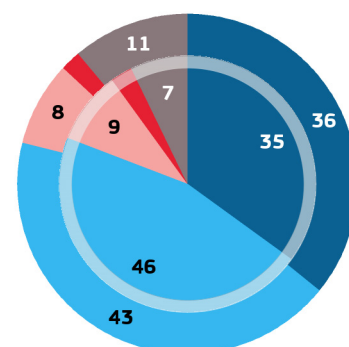

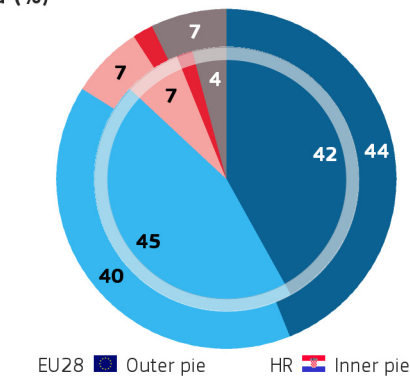

QB4.4 To what extent do you agree or disagree with each of the following statements?

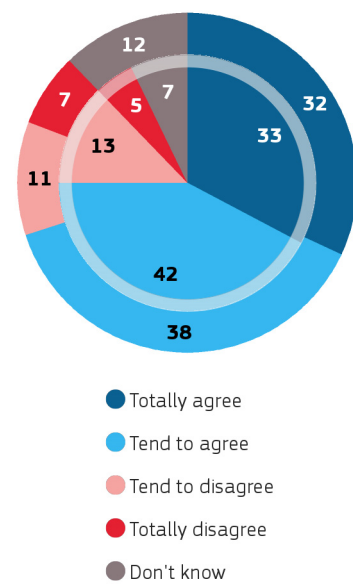

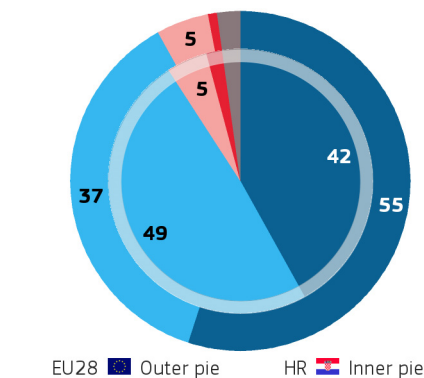
Adapting to the adverse impacts of climate change can have positive outcomes for citizens in the EU (%)

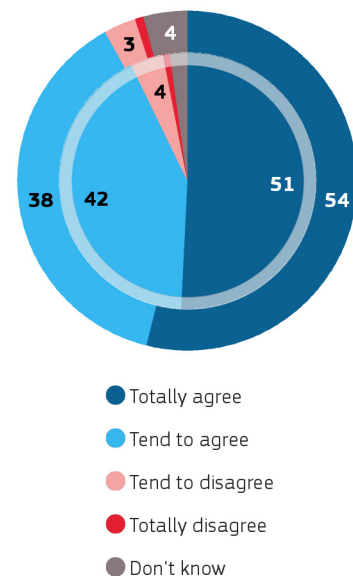
