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Methodology: face-to-face

1. COUNTRY HIGHLIGHTS

Nearly three-quarters of respondents in Romania consider climate change a “very serious” problem (74%, EU average: 69%). This is a rise of 11 percentage points since 2013, and the second largest increase observed in the EU. When compared with other issues, 12% identify climate change as the most serious problem facing the world (EU average: 15%).

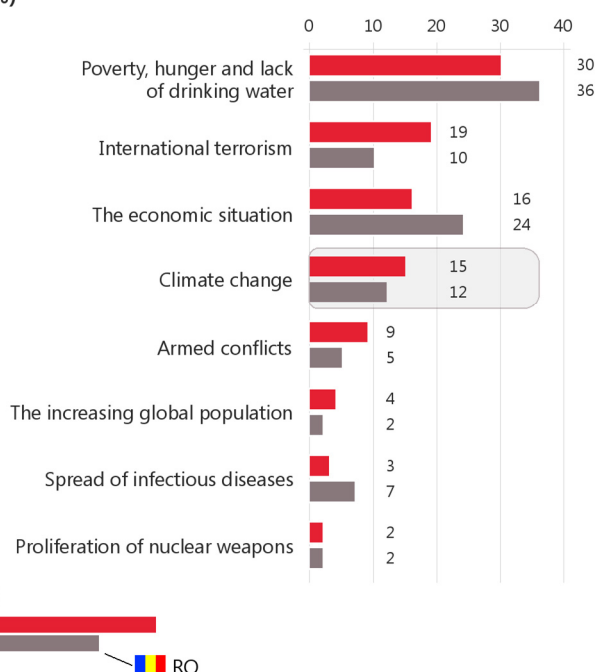
Compared with respondents in other EU Member States, respondents in Romania are significantly less likely to say they have personally taken any action to fight climate change in the past six months (25%, compared with the EU average of 49%). However, when practical measures are mentioned, we find that 86% have taken at least one action beneficial to climate change, an increase of 25 percentage points since 2013. These measures include:

- Buying locally produced and seasonal food (42%, +16 percentage points)
- Trying to reduce waste and regularly separate it for recycling (37%, +8 percentage points)
- Choosing new household appliances mainly for their energy efficiency (34%, +11 percentage points)
- Insulating their homes to reduce energy consumption (33%, well above the EU average of 23%)

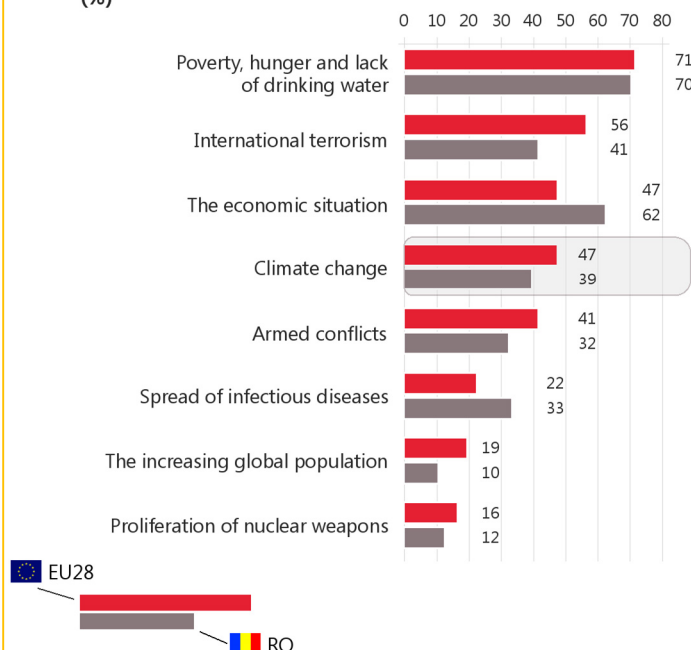
More than eight in ten respondents (86%) agree that fighting climate change will only be effective if all countries of the world act together.

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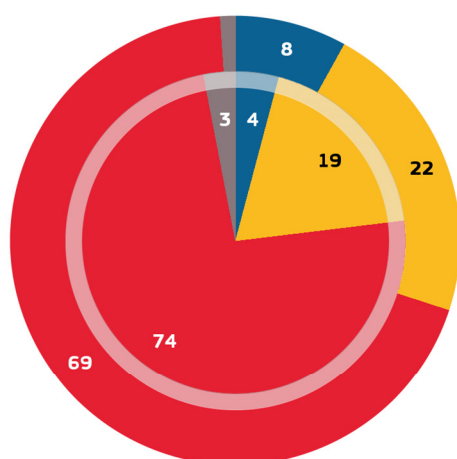

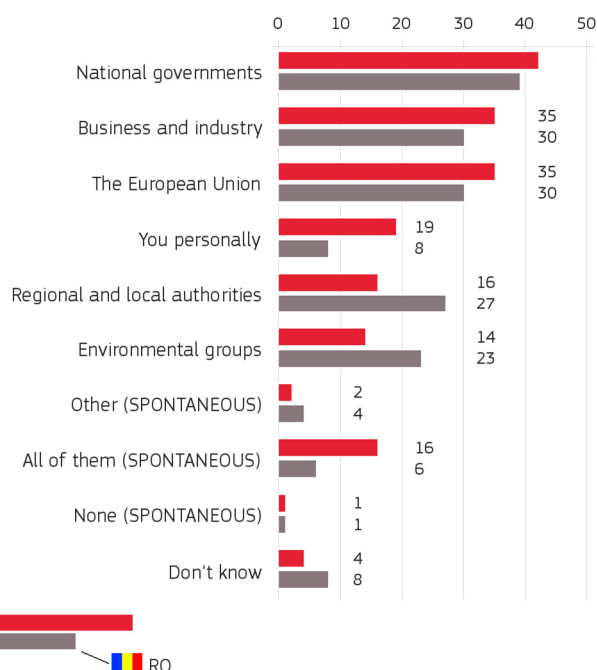

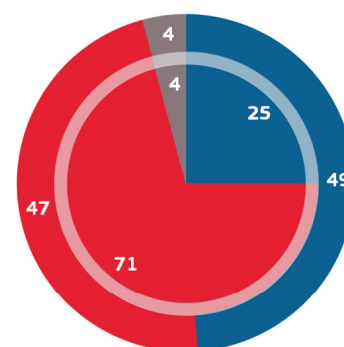
QA3 In your opinion, who within the EU is responsible for tackling climate change? (MULTIPLE ANSWERS POSSIBLE)

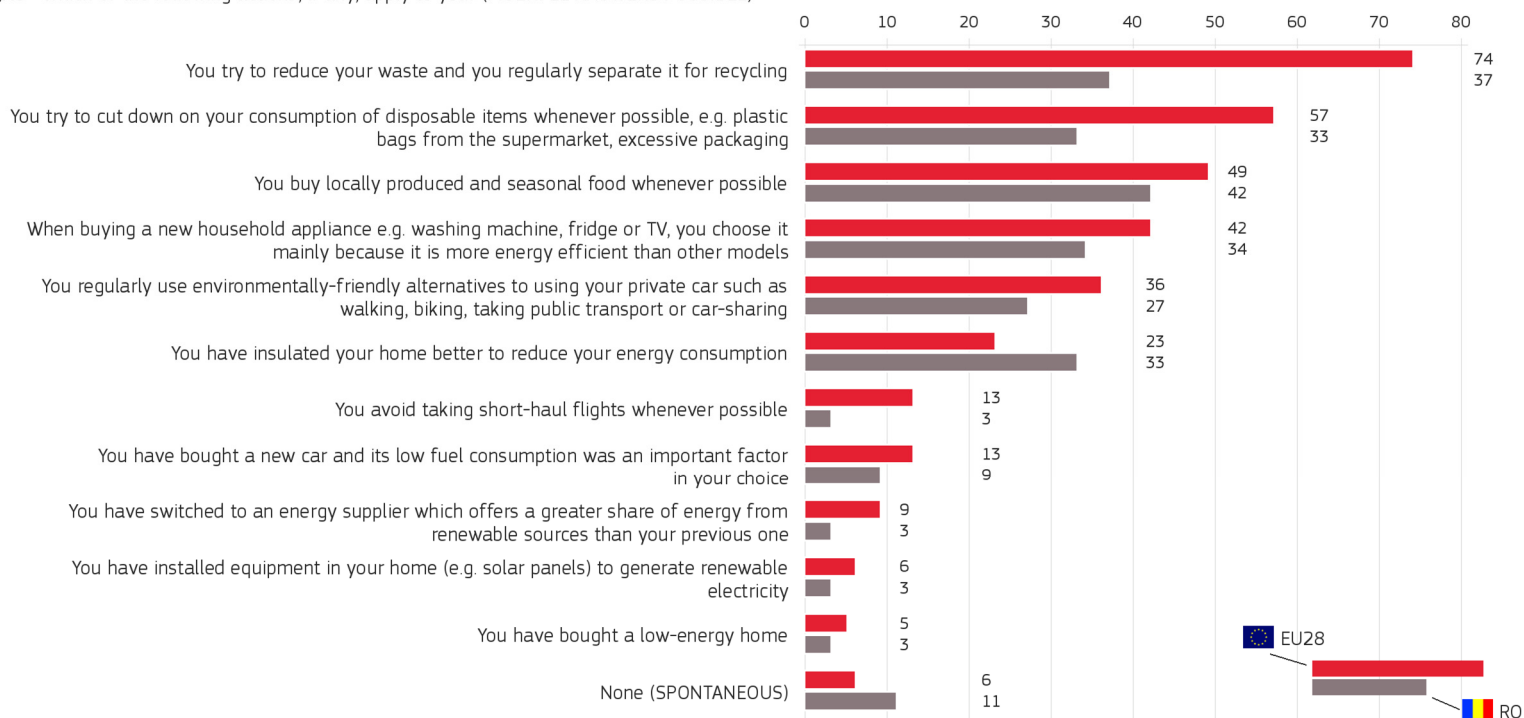

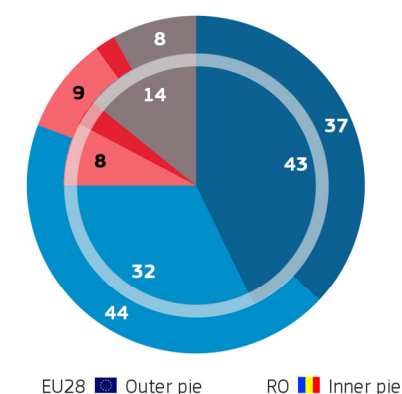
QA6 Which of the following actions, if any, apply to you? (MULTIPLE ANSWERS POSSIBLE)

Fighting climate change and using energy more efficiently can boost the economy and jobs in the EU (%)

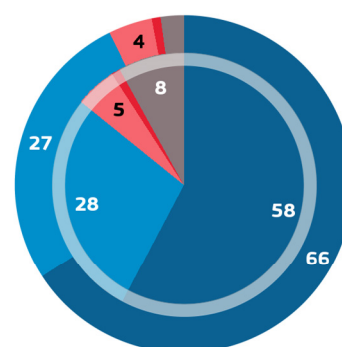

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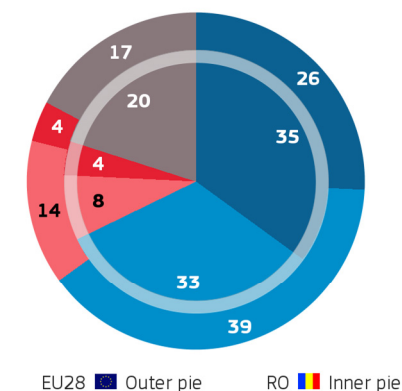

Reducing fossil fuel imports from outside the EU can benefit the EU economically (%)

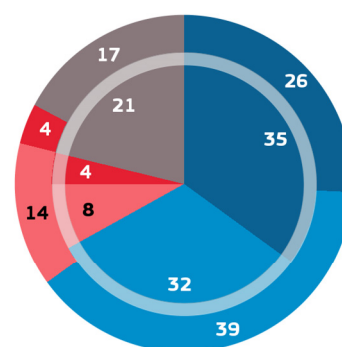

Reducing fossil fuel imports from outside the EU can increase the security of EU energy supplies (%)

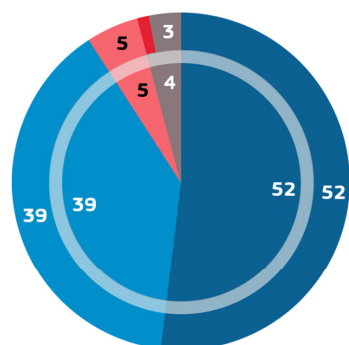

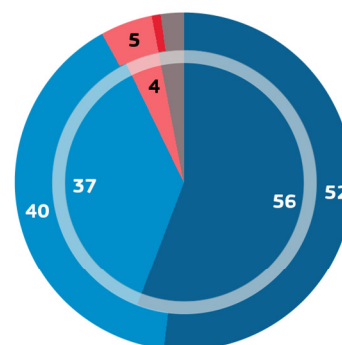
QA7 How important do you think it is that the (NATIONALITY) government sets targets to increase the amount of renewable energy used, such as wind or solar power, by 2030? (%)
