Methodology: face-to-face

1. COUNTRY HIGHLIGHTS

Climate change is considered the most serious problem facing the world in Denmark. Indeed, 30% of respondents in Denmark say that this is the most serious issue, well above the EU average (15%).

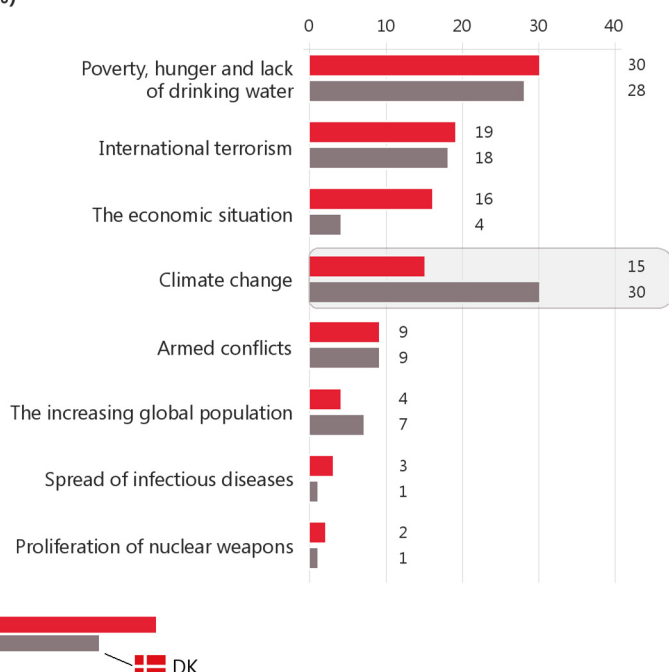
More than half of respondents in Denmark say they have taken personal action to fight climate change over the past six months (53%). However, as in most EU countries, in practice many more respondents have actually taken measures to combat climate change (96%). This includes:

- Trying to reduce waste and regularly separate it for recycling (72%, no change since 2013)
- Trying to cut down consumption of disposable items like plastic bags (66%, +8 percentage points since 2013)
- Choosing energy-efficient new household appliances (65%, +8 percentage points since 2013)
- Buying locally produced and seasonal food (53%, +7 percentage points since 2013)
- Using environmentally-friendly alternatives to private cars (53%, +7 percentage points since 2013)

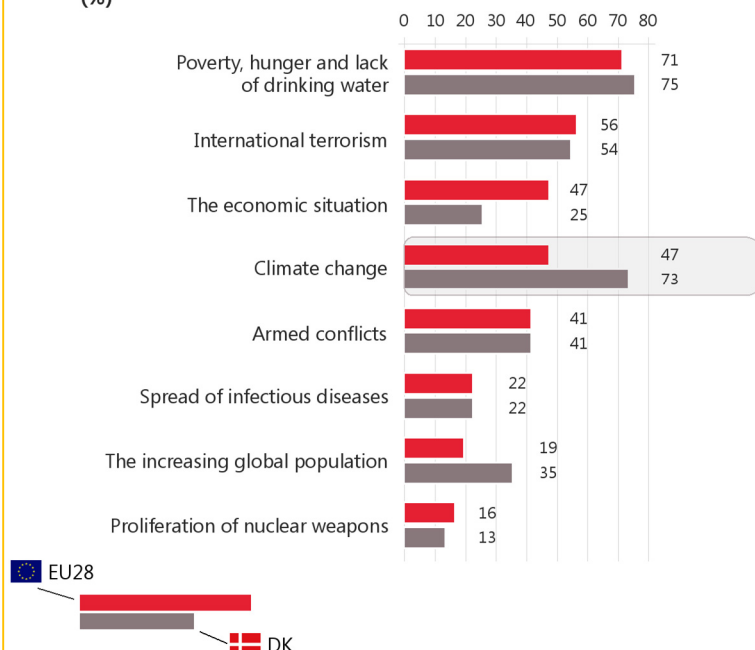
More than nine out of ten (94%) agree that fighting climate change will only be effective if all countries of the world act together. There is strong support for national action to improve energy efficiency (95%) and increase the use of renewable energy (94%) by 2030.

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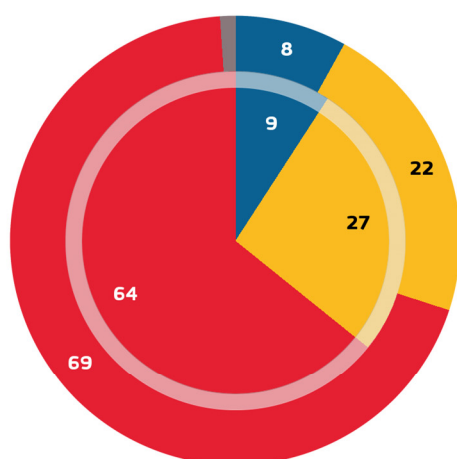

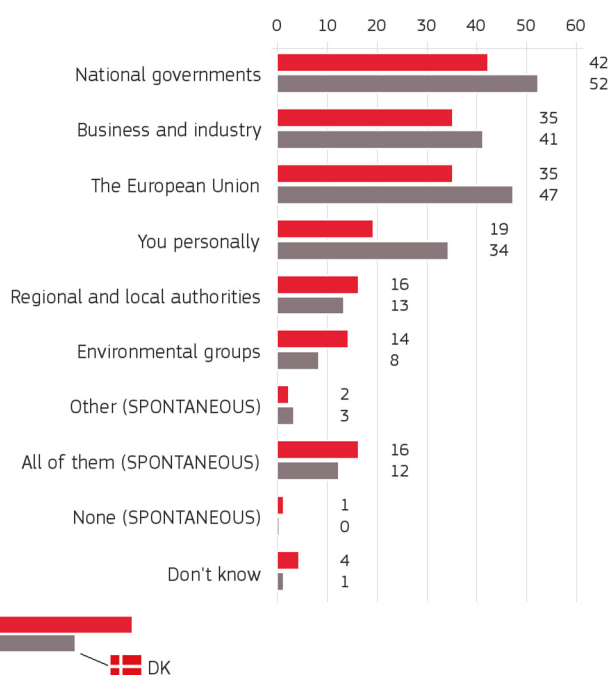

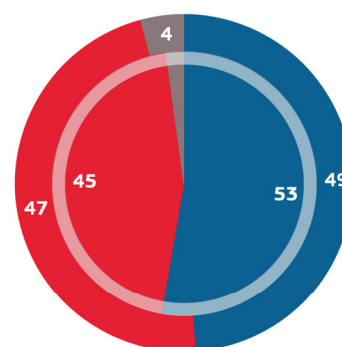
QA3 In your opinion, who within the EU is responsible for tackling climate change? (MULTIPLE ANSWERS POSSIBLE)

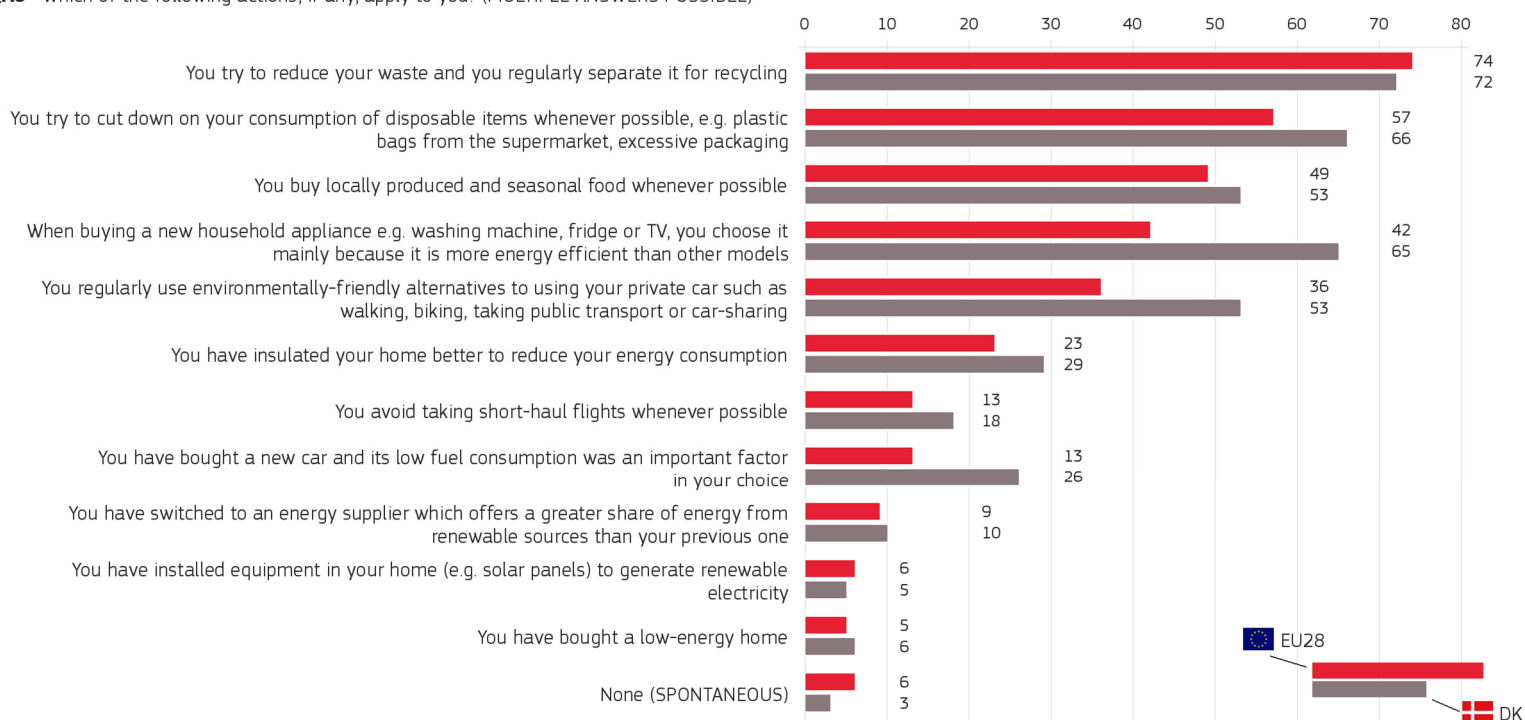

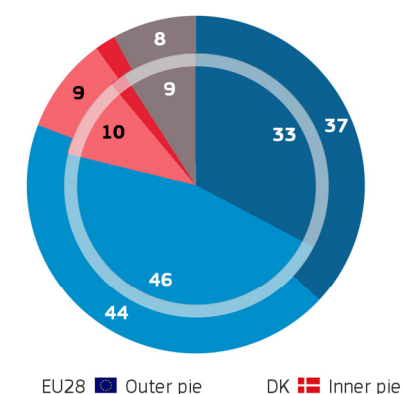
QA6 Which of the following actions, if any, apply to you? (MULTIPLE ANSWERS POSSIBLE)

Fighting climate change and using energy more efficiently can boost the economy and jobs in the EU (%)

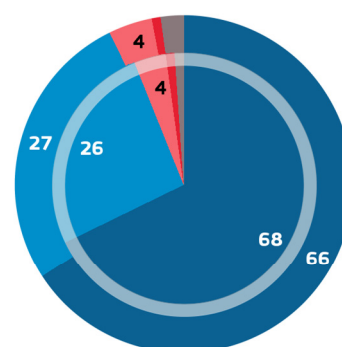

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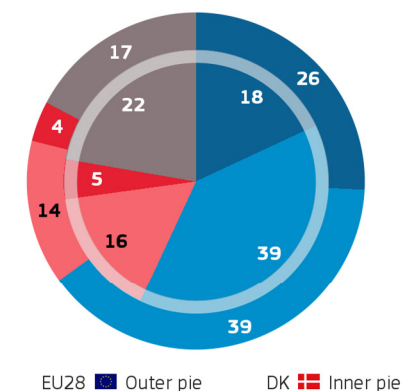

Reducing fossil fuel imports from outside the EU can benefit the EU economically (%)



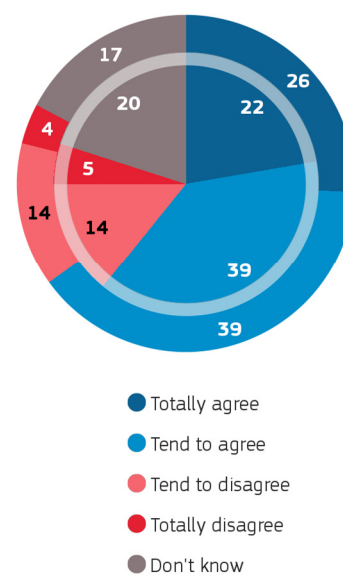

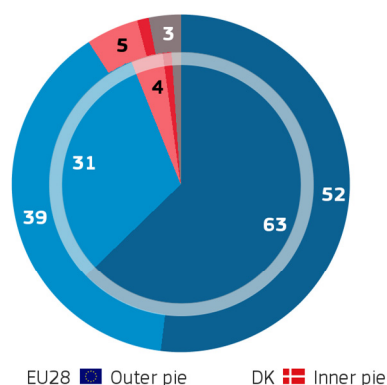

QA7 How important do you think it is that the (NATIONALITY) government sets targets to increase the amount of renewable energy used, such as wind or solar power, by 2030? (%)

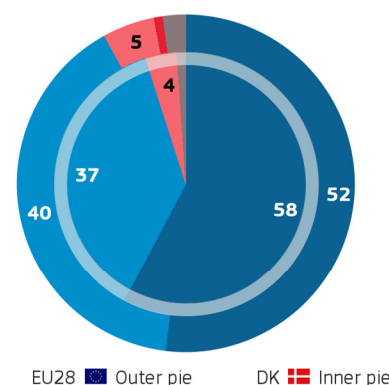
